Kevin Everett Carlyle received his Eagle Award at a Boy Scout Court of Honor held December 14, 1996. The ceremony was held at the First Presbyterian Church in Liberty, Missouri, sponsor of Troop 374.

The Eagle award is the highest achievement earned in Boy Scouting, and only two percent of Scouts achieve this award. After the Scout works up through the ranks, he performs an Eagle project to develop his leadership skills while providing a community service. For his Eagle Project, Kevin planned and provided leadership to a group of Scouts and adults who built a 30' x 6' x 2' planter of Windsor Stones at the entrance of Earnest Shepherd Memorial Youth Center. The planter contains seven mulched shrubs and serves to beautify the entrance and provide a barrier to an abandoned roadway.

Kevin joined Troop 374 at the end of fifth grade after five active years in Cub Scouting, and in three years held positions as Den Chief, Assistant Patrol Leader, and Scribe. He has completed Junior Leadership Training twice and the C.O.P.E. team building training. Kevin is very active in Troop 374 activities, having attended nearly all troop campouts and meetings since he joined.

Kevin attended two years each at Day Camp at Longview Lake and Webelos Camp at Camp Naish. He has gone to Boy Scout Camp at H. Roe Bartle Reservation for four summers, and hopes to work on staff the summer of 1997. He is a Brave in the Tribe of Mic-O-Say, an honorary camping society at H. Roe Bartle Reservation. He has earned 34 Merit Badges, the World Conservation Badge, and an Eagle Bronze Palm. Kevin has been accepted to attend Boy Scout National Jamboree at Fort A.P. Hill in Virginia next summer.

Kevin is in the ninth grade at Liberty Junior High School, where he is on the Honor Roll and a member of the French Club. Kevin's parents are Don and Phyllis Carlyle of Liberty.
